We will pickup Madison group on our way thru town toward Perry

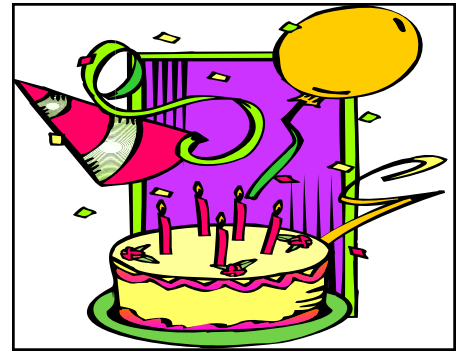
We will be ordering from the menu. They will include the gratuity on your ticket.

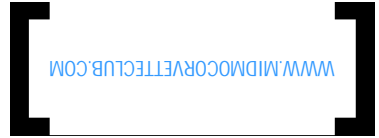

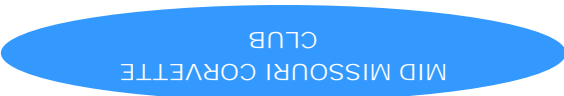
